


# MISSION: TRANSITION

In 2014, 9 Mission Transition participants obtained employment, went on to college, obtained their driver's license, began vocational/independent living training and more! The Mission Transition Project will run from June to August 2015 and will include one on one support from Disability Action Center staff, employment readiness, higher education and financial aid assistance, family and individual workshops planned to meet your needs, and **cash stipends** to assist you with an education, employment, or technology related goal.
